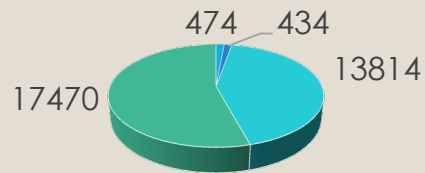
Mission & Vision Statement

Race/Ethnicity of Homeless 2022



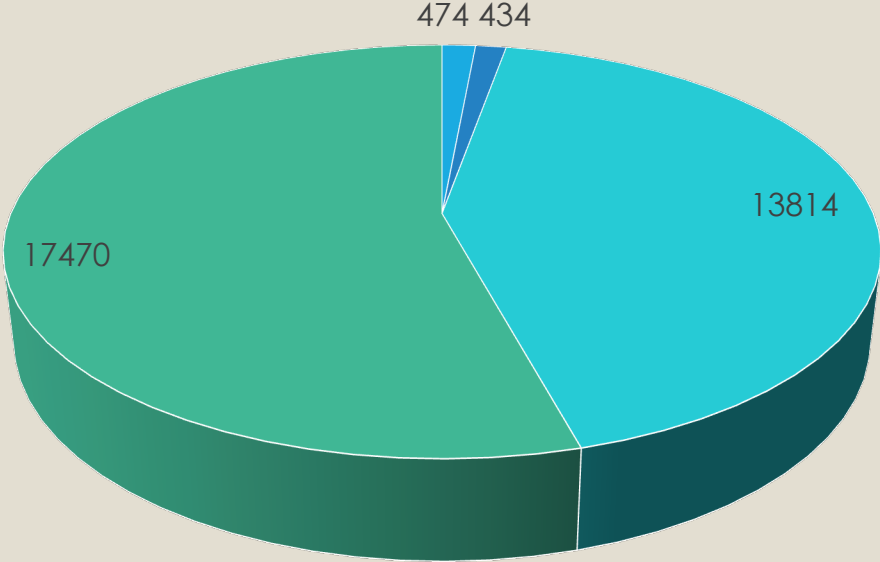

Other Facts About the 2022 Homeless Population in Los Angeles County:

- 9% are under age 18.
- 32% are female.
- 16% are in family units (often headed by a single mother).
- 18% are physically disabled.
- 9% are developmental disabled.
- 41% are chronically homeless.
- 24% have substance abuse disorders.
- 22% suffer from serious mental illness.
- 33% experienced domestic/intimate partner violence.
