NAJEE ALI

OPERATION HOPE

Najee Ali is an award-winning nationally celebrated civil rights activist community organizer,and author.

Ali's career began in the 1988 as a volunteer for presidential candidate Reverend Jesse Jackson, which was the doorway for his involvement into political and social activism. He has worked for or with nationally celebrated figures that include President Barack Obama, Rev Al Sharpton, Martin Luther King III, Dick Gregory, John Hope Bryant, Congressmember Karen Bass.

A native of Gary, Indiana, Najee migrated to South Central Los Angeles where later his fearless activism helped spearhead and was the driving force of "Sherrice's Law" – This law helps protect children from sexual assaults and violent attacks. It was signed into law in 2001 by California Governor Gray Davis, in memory of seven year old Sherrice Iverson, who was kidnapped, raped, and murdered in a Las Vegas Casino on May 25th 1997. Its the first law named after a slain African-American child in U.S. history.

Ali, is also the founder of Los Angeles Muslim Heritage Month which is officially recognized during the month of July every year by the city of Los Angeles. This resolution was presented in 2014 by Los Angeles City Council members Curren Price and Bob Blumenfield and passed unanimously by the Los, Angeles City Council.

Ali currently serves as a Chaplain for Los Angeles Mayor Garcetti Crisis Response Team.

From leading the charge for police reform to negotiating gang truces, Ali continues to evolve as the people's champion and confronts injustice wherever it may be.



HAN SUNG CHANG

6TH PRESIDENT OF THE KOREAN YOUNG ADULT TEAM

In 1991, Han Sung Chang joined a youth group that provided protection services to Korean Americans. especially shop owners who were most at risk when they closed their shops at night. This group rapidly expanded from 24 members to over 360 members shortly after Saigu started. In the absence of any intervention from the police and fire department, the youth group began to move out to protect Koreatown and the community. Reflecting on the events of the LA riots, Han Sung calls for the Korean American community to unite as one, in order to prevent tragedies of a similar kind.

American, Pauline grew up in the
Crenshaw area of Los Angeles. After
graduating from Pepperdine
University in Business Administration,
Pauline enjoyed a successful career in
Human Resources management.

She is a certified subject matter expert and has provided testimony in numerous criminal cases involving extremism. In partnership with law enforcement partners, she has helped thwart potential extremist attacks against Jews and other vulnerable communities. Her passion lies in ensuring resources are readily available for all veterans, especially those that have been disenfranchised and marginalized such as women veterans and BIPOC veterans to include preserving their contributions in service through storytelling engagement activities. Joanna is currently the National Field Manager for Common Defense, a grassroots movement of progressive veterans. Joanna is also an original co-founder of AZ VetsForward, a group of military veterans in Arizona that worked to defend democratic values at home by winning hearts and minds of the American voters in the 2020 election cycle.

Having now resided in Arizona for 14years, Joanna is rooted and committed to the progress of Arizona. She raised her three children here, all having attended public elementary, middle school, and high school in the Chandler Unified School District. She became a 1st generation college graduate in 2010 from Arizona State University, utilizing her MGIB/Post 9-11 GI Bill from her honorable service in the Marine Corps and started a legacy there when her first born attended and graduated from ASU in 2018. Joanna graduated as an Obama Mentor Scholar, Magna Cum Laude and a highly motivated Sun Devil who would later return to ASU to make lasting impact.

CHAIR OF THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Supervisor Holly J. Mitchell currently serves as Chair of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. As the daughter of parents who were public servants and a third-generation Angeleno, Mitchell leads with a deep understanding of the vital safety net LA County provides to millions of families and is committed to ensuring that all residents can thrive.

Since being elected to the Board of Supervisors on November 3rd, 2020. Supervisor Mitchell has made poverty alleviation a countywide priority and has anchored an equitable recovery plan from the health and economic pandemic caused by COVID-19. In 2000, the congregation purchased The Great Western Forum (previous home of the Los Angeles Lakers), which they also operated as a commercial entertainment venue before selling it to Madison Square Garden in 2013.

Shinese also hope to bring two communities together through diversity.


YONAH HONG




My name is Ruben Hemander and I came to the United States at the age of 20. Three years later, a tragedy struck my life that forever changed me: I became blind.




