# OUR HISTORY

- ▶ The Chinese United Methodist Church (UMC) of Los Angeles, under the leadership of Rev. Joseph Ma, felt that an English-speaking ministry was necessary, as each generation of their congregation was becoming more assimilated to the western culture around them. The following is an account of our history.

# OUR HISTORY (CONTINUED)

## ► 1977

We began the mission church in Orange County in a small chapel at the Orange UMC in the city of Orange. Rev. Leo Hsu, Associate Pastor to the Chinese UMC was assigned to the mission church. Thirty people together with several friends, which included five core families Tom and May Lou, Ed and Mabel Joe, Eddie and Ruth Wong, Charlie and Minnie Lou, and Sen and Clarice Lew, began Sunday evening worship services. Bing Wong was the Administrative Board Chairperson. The first choir consisted of two members, Celeste Lew and pianist Arleen Lew. Craig Miller from CUMC of LA served as our Youth Director and Music Director.

# OUR HISTORY (CONTINUED)

▶ **1978**

The church was chartered as *Chinese United Methodist Church of Orange County*.

▶ **1979**

The Wings of Faith youth choir gave many concerts at several churches throughout Orange County, Los Angeles and even traveled to Northern California to perform. They were awarded a certificate by the United Methodist Board of Discipleship and were recognized as one of the most Outstanding Youth Groups in the United Methodist Church.

▶ **1981**

CUMC of Orange County became a self-supporting church.

# OUR HISTORY (CONTINUED)

## ▶ **1988**

We relocated to the Lark Ellen Christian Church in Brea.

## ▶ **1991**

We relocated to Orangethorpe UMC in Fullerton, where we established a shared facility covenant relationship. The Administrative Board approved changing our name to *Cornerstone United Methodist Church*.

# OUR HISTORY (CONTINUED)

## ▶ 2003

We relocated to Placentia UMC and established a new shared facility covenant relationship, where we serve at the present time.

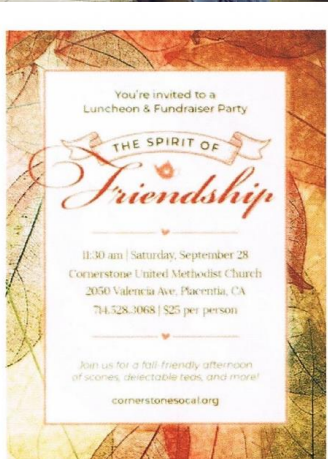
# MISSION
